What has Newcastle University done practically on campus to make it COVID-safe and to support our students?

Our priority has been to make sure everyone is safe on campus, so we've put in place targeted cleaning measures across our facilities. Screens and barriers have been installed to support physical distancing and wipes and hand sanitiser are available at various locations across campus. We also have an early warning system to detect potential Covid-19 outbreaks in the University community.

To ensure all members of our community remain safe when visiting our campus, an asymptomatic testing site was set up with the help of qualified technicians and student workers. Located right at the centre of campus, any colleague, visitor or student registered at Newcastle University can secure a test through our easy to use online booking system

We have put in place a range of support for our students during the COVID-19 pandemic including financial, wellbeing and practical support.

We have set up an IT Loan scheme so all registered students without access to suitable computer facilities may be able to receive assistance, through either a laptop loan, a grant to buy a device if based outside of the UK, or a grant to purchase internet access.

Our Student Finance Team offer Emergency Loans to students struggling with money.

Our Student Health and Wellbeing Teams are there to offer students support during this difficult time with; 1:1 Counselling sessions, Wellbeing Workshops on a range of topics and our Talk Campus app which offers students 24/7 peer support, wherever they are in the world.

Finally, we've developed a call centre dedicated to providing students with the support they need and answering all enquiries about Covid-19. From providing emergency food supplies to students in self-isolation to giving advice on where to access COVID Testing, our colleagues are here to help and support students.

How we have helped in the fight against Covid-19?

Since the start of the pandemic we have been involved in the UK's fight against coronavirus. We have donated state-of-the-art testing equipment to the NHS and our academics have been involved in vital research. We have also developed the NU COVID-19 Project which will co-ordinate and maximise the contribution we can make as a University to the wider community in response to the COVID-19 crisis.

More recently The Newcastle University First Responders a voluntary, student-led initiative ran by Newcastle University medical students have been trained to work at a Covid-19 vaccination hub in North Shields just outside Newcastle.

Incredibly by February 2021, the centre had administered over 30,000 vaccines with the help of our students and we couldn't be prouder of their efforts throughout the vaccination period and beyond.

What about Fall 2021?

The UK government is aiming to lift all restrictions on social interaction by Summer 2021 and to have offered all adults their first vaccine dose by the end of July 2021.

Whilst we wait for clearer picture of what Fall 2021 will look like, we are building flexibility into our planning so we can deliver a blended experience in line with changing government guidance.

Newcastle University is a World Top 160 University (QS World Rankings) located in the beautiful, student-friendly city of Newcastle upon Tyne in North East England. Many undergraduate courses still have places for Fall 2021.
